- Morse code is named after Samuel Morse, one of the inventors of the telegraph.
- Each symbol is formed by a sequence of dots and dashes.
- Morse code has been used since 1844.
- The Modern International Morse Code was standardized in 1865.
- Morse code can also be generated by turning lights on and off, tapping an object, or sounding a whistle.
- You can speak Morse Code by saying "Dit" for the dots and "Dah" for the dashes.
