

Games for the Main Gallery (or anywhere in the museum)

Twenty Questions: One person is "it" and picks a secret artefact. Others in the group must guess what it is by asking yes or no questions about the artefact: Is it brightly coloured? Is it small enough to hold in your hand? Is it used in the kitchen? (The museum is also a fun place to play "I Spy"!)

Storytelling: Use the museum as your inspiration and make up a story featuring the artefacts on display. Take turns in a group with each person adding the next part of the tale.

Be a Curator! The collections curator decides which artefacts should be in the museum. As you explore, pick one or two artefacts from each exhibit that you would choose for your own museum. In your group, discuss why you would make those choices.
